An Annual Title I Meeting will be held before October 31st of the current school year. All parents will be invited and encouraged to attend. Flat Shoals Elementary School is a schoolwide Title I school, and all parents are invited and encouraged to attend all Title I meetings, trainings, and workshops. Printed flyers are posted at the school and sent home with students announcing upcoming events. Announcements for these events are also posted on the school's website and the school's marquee.

Monthly school and Title I newsletters, a schoolwide phone system, informal communication, personal telephone calls, and at least two parent-teacher conferences will keep parents informed of upcoming Title I programs and activities. A parent information board will be available for parents that will include school and PTA news.

Meetings and training workshops for parents will be offered at flexible times to allow parents to participate in the school's programs. These events will be offered in the mornings and early evenings throughout the school year. Light refreshments may be provided for parents and childcare is also available as needed. Flat Shoals Elementary will survey parents about the topics of programs they consider to be most beneficial, the schedule, and location of meetings/workshops. Planned meetings/workshops will afford parents opportunities to share experiences with other parents, formulate suggestions, and participate in decisions relating to the education of their children. The planned meetings/workshops will be informal with staff. Invited guest speakers will also help parents to accomplish their goals.

Instructional Coaches and district level coaches, in addition to the teachers, will provide support and academic skills to help parents. Instructional materials and literature about how to help children succeed in school will be offered for checkout from the Parent Resource Center. Parent "Make It - Take It" workshops will extend the Title I program to the home.

BUILDING CAPACITY OF SCHOOL STAFF

Flat Shoals Elementary will provide training to educate teachers, specialized instructional support personnel, principals, and other school leaders, and other staff, with the assistance of parents, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, implement and coordinate parent programs, and build ties between parents and the school by:
